DRY CASTING 4TH APRIL 1965

Well our current Casting Competition has closed for the year and it was pleasing to see 19 seniors, 2 visitors and 1 Junior still competing, even though most knew who the winner would be - Allen Bunnett with a total score of 1241 points. Congrats Allan, that makes it two in a row.

3 The weather was almost perfect, a fine sunny day with a moderate easterly breeze prevailing, of course, with weather like this some casters must expect "the axe", and was it sharp as you will see later. (Refer to handicap section)

In the Level Line Distance event Bill Bridger is still improving breaking his own record of 435 ft. with a cast of 438 ft. Just behind Bill was Allen Bunnett with a cast of 427 ft. and Ken Jones with his best cast 392 ft., some excellent distance casting. This event was won by W. Utting with 329, 131 and 460. Second was A. Bunnett, 400, 59, 459. Allan lost 42 ft. by putting two casts outside the lane, and R. Kildahl was third with 314, 143, 457. As you can see only 3 points separated the first 3 places.

Three members scored all four casts in the Double Handed Accuracy event, they were K. Jones, R. Tucker and W. Utting. I was fortunate in scoring a Bull (my first ever) while A. Bunnett and T. Walsh recorded a near miss. Allen Bunnett won this event with 51/80. Bill Utting and Bob Tucker tied for second with 49/80 and Ken Jones with 43/80 was third.

Bill Bridger won the Single handed event with 26/40, Bob Tichbon with 24/40 was second and Doug Talbot and Bob Tucker tied for third with 20/40. Bill Bridger was the nearest to the Bull with a near miss, but 5 members scored with all four casts, they were Bill Bridger, Ken Jones, Ron Kildahl, Bob Tichbon and Bob Tucker.

Ken Jones and Bob Tucker were the only members to score with all 8 accuracy casts.

JUNIOR COMPETITION

Don Bridger was the only Junior to see out the year and as Don will be a senior next year, some of the seniors will have to look to their laurels. Don slashed his handicap from 151 to 106 with some excellent casting, averaging 344 ft. straight down the middle. Don's scores were 344, 151, 495 for the E.H., 47/80 for the D.H., and 25/40 for the S.H. scoring with all 8 accuracy casts. Nice going Don.

FIELD DAY GARDEN ISLAND 24-25TH APRIL 1965

Weather conditions:- North easterly winds backed by a heavy ground swell with the sea calm. The fish were generally hard to locate though, as usual several lads returned to base with good bags of fish to be weighed in. 26 members, 5 senior visitors, plus 4 juniors and a junior visitor made an attendance of 36 on this Field Day, which was not a bad roll up so close after Easter.

It was good to see among our regular members quite a few of our new and older members in Stefan Knezy, George Hamilton, Roger Broinski, Dave Latta etc., just to mention a few, and also to see our visitors enjoying themselves by knocking off a few nice fish.

Alan Livesey was first in with a good bag of fish to weigh, followed by Ted Savage also with a good bag. Bob Tucker was also well to the fore with an excellent bag which included an 8 lb Salmon. Ken Harvey also had a Salmon of 7 lbs., as did Jack Harvey with a $6\frac{1}{2}$ lb Salmon, and junior Les Newton, not to be outdone came in with the heaviest Salmon of $8\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. Trust these juniors to show us up. Last, but not least on the mention list, is of course, Tom Smith's bag of $43\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of Tailor which was the heaviest bag of fish to be weighed in, and included a Tailor of 7 lb 1 oz, which was indeed a creditable capture, especially when considering the difficult position he was angling from. Good work Tom.

The heaviest fish caught on this field day was taken by Doug Salt, a visitor, which was a Salmon of 8 lb 11 oz. What with juniors and visitors, one is flat out getting a look in these days, not that we really mind.

The second bay north was almost barren of Tailor etc., as Ron Shirley, Ron Kildahl, Bob Klein, Terry Manion and myself will readily agree. If they were there, there was too much water between them, for we could barely raise a bite between us. It would appear that the northern areas are the more likely places to toss a bait, as they are not as heavily fished as the bays on the back beach, and the vantage points down south which also yielded so few fish on this occasion. As a matter of fact, Terry Tuller, Don Webb and Doug Newton were surprised at the scarcity of fish and were somewhat surprised when junior Lew Newton made their faces red by knocking off a nice $8\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Salmon.
