

MURCHISON BY BUS: MARCH 1971

Next March seems a long way off - but if I am to have any support for my suggestion, I will need to have an indication of those wishing to go to the Murchison by bus, very soon, so I can make the necessary arrangements.

Basically the idea stems from the fact that there is a lot of driving in a long weekend to the Murchison. My suggestion is that we hire an air conditioned bus containing 30 sleeper seats plus 6 ordinary seats, with full facilities to carry rods and all gear and which would carry two drivers.
