APRIL FIELD DAY:

FLINDERS BAY:

When a man wins the field day competition for the year it is usually said he was lucky or touched. However, when he does it year after year this sort of statement no longer carries any conviction. Granted, as in any sport, a little bit of luck comes into it, however, a true champion makes his own luck by dedication to and the study of all aspects of his sport. By putting together all that he has learned and tried, eliminating all that he does not need or that does not suit his purpose or style; he makes fewer mistakes and so takes advantage of his luck when it does come. I'll bet if you ask him he will tell you this learning, trying addition and elimination process is a continuing thing, going on at every opportunity. While we are on the subject of asking, I'll make another small bet, ask the champ himself anything about gear, rigs, bait, reading water or whatever, that you find him anxious to help others enjoy the sport of angling.

Graham gave us hope by hooking and landing a Salmon a few minutes after 3 p.m. He was lucky to do so, as I practically beat it to death with the gaff trying to land it for him. Brian was next in action, also landing a Salmon, soon after he hooked another but lost it. Tom was fishing steadily taking some nice skippy and herring. Ralph Lerch was also among the herring, but this was all the action for the night. After dark, Ron, Graham, Eric and I were enjoying a cup of tea when along came Corcoran skiting about his skippy. Tom pulled up a chair and sat down. The next second, he was over backwards as the chair legs sank in the sand. Undeterred he restored himself in the chair, and once again proceeded to blow his bags about the size of his skippy. All that hot air must have effected the chair, for with a resounding crack it collapsed in a shattered heap, once more dumping the mighty skippy fisherman on his posterior. NEW STRUCTURE OF DRYCASTING AWARDS:

It has been decided to adopt a new method towards allocating the trophies at the end of the competition year.

Basically the number of trophies will be 9, awarded to the best casters in the various sections. This is achieved by allocation of points in each section which will be:-

Major event (Level Line, D.H.A. & S.H.A.) - Top Ten awarded points from 10 to 1 in order of merit.

In each of the following sections: Level Line Distance; Double Handed Accuracy; Single Handed Accuracy; Double Handed Open; Single Handed Open; the top five will be awarded points from 5 to 1 in order of merit.

The points awarded as above will be collated and the top caster in each section will win that event and the overall winner, runner-up and third place getter will be forthcoming from the overall total points. In the event of a tie, a count back system will be used.

The overall winner will be the highest points scorer and this top award should be significantly greater than all the others.

NEW INNOVATION FOR DRYCASTING:

It was also passed at the last Committee Meeting that instead of using our usual gold ribbon sinker markers, we are now going to use a 9" leader of any weight covered by an orange plastic "spaghetti".

The distances in the D.H. Open will be shown on the board in future. There is now no restriction on sinker weights in the Open Events.
