The President reported a Special Committee Meeting to consider work needed on the Kalbarri House consisting of gravel to the front of the house and the clearing of scrub to the sides of the block as required by the Bush Fire Board. The work was authorised at a cost of \$150.

The revised Club Etiquette is being prepared and should be shortly available.

D.C.O. mentioned that June Casting date was uncertain but that has been since confirmed as the 18th.

Bob suggested spark plugs for sinkers, about the right weight and no great loss when they get snagged. He also explained the correct way to use a cliff gaff, that is, to let the line go slack and allow the gaff line to hold all the weight of the fish.

A slide show by Lofty showed scenes of the area and some catches to whet our appetites and despite a blown lamp and a dash home by Ron Flynn for a replacement projector the show was well received.

With just about all our active members booking to go in June, it should be a week long, old time "Garden Island" type event, and we are all looking forward to it.
