#### PANTHER

Are you tired of frying and grilling fish Here are a couple of recipes for pickled fish which you might find interesting.

BISMARK HERRING (Can be made into Roll Mops)

Fillet Herring, spread with Australian mustard. Boil 12 parts wine vinegar with one part water. Bay Leaves - 2 or 3 as to taste. Add salt, black pepper corns for approx. 5 mins.

For Roll Mops secure with tooth picks and put in jars. Place in casserole, a layer of fillets, a layer of onion rings until filled.

Cover with fairly hot vinegar, seal and store for at least 7 days - The longer the better.

## MAJESTIC HERRING

Use Herring whole or fillets Lightly salt and pepper - place in container, sprinkle with mustard add f or 2 bay leaves, cover with mayonaise toss to mix, leave in fridge for 2 days, toss frequently.
