



A.A.A. REPORT - APRIL 1990

1. 1991 State Boating Championships : 23/24th March. This is a week earlier than usual to allow anglers going to South Australia for the nationals to still compete in the W. A. championships.

2. Two new clubs affiliated with AAA - Quinns Rock Fishing Club, and Leander Fishing Club (Dongara).

- 3. Port Kennedy Marina: AAA is pursuing the issue of development of this private marina which is just south of LongPoint, on the south edge of the Marine Park (Rockingham Shire). Two main issues are environmental consequences, and maintenance of beach access anglers.
- 4. Proposed 90/91 AAA calendar of events is out. Comments from clubs are invited.

(i) Bunbury has proposed that the state rock and beach be held on June LWE (perhaps at Walpole).

5. WA Recreation Fishing Document is now out. Clubs and individual anglers are invited to make submissions, noting points of both agreement and disagreement.

- 9. Drift nets. U.S.A. has moved to mark cans as not being drift-netted fish ("DOLPHIN FREE").
- 10. WA Rec Council Raffle coming up. Clubs get to keep 50% of proceeds from their sales.
- 11. AAA & WA Rec Council to co-produce a document detailing access and camping conditions on WA beaches.
- 12. AAA & WA Rec Council trying to address the problem of how to meet professional levels that other bodies have (eg; surveys, submissions, interfacing with government and other agencies). Suggestion is that some of the tax on tackle may be used for this.
