Moved Andy Thorgersen, seconded Peter Pekaar the Treasurer's report be accepted and accounts be passed for payment, carried.

<u>Field Days</u> Peter Osborne reported on the coming Capes South field day, and costs and arrangements for the May Rottnest Field Day.

Peter has a job away from Perth and will not be available for the next 3 months. Peet Wessels will act as FDO for the May field day, Pat McKeown will act for the June field day, John Curtis will handle the Local field days.

<u>Dry Casting Officer</u> Peter Pekaar reported on the April casting. Terry Fuller advised of the changed area for casting for coming months as reported in Reel Talk.

<u>Property Officer</u> Some bookings coming in, including for Easter 2014. The deeds for the Kalbarri property are now held by Ray Walker. Thanks to Pat McKeown for lodging the documents and collecting the deeds.

<u>Social Organiser</u> More club shirts have been ordered. Members were requested to fill in and return the menu forms for the Presentation night, from the March Reel Talk.

Recorder Recorder John Curtis advised he had received an application for a salmon for section 4 of the Open competition.

Several members have close to the required number of species for the Species competition, and should attempt to catch some more to allow presentation of the badge at the Presentation night in June.

The club competition year ends on 30 April and members should put in applications for the open fishing section.

AAA report

A presentation was made to outgoing Fisheries Minister, Norman Moore at the March Delegates meeting.

John Curtis thanked all Surfcasters members who attending the presentation.

AAAWA has sent a letter to Recfishwest about the lack of action from Department of Fisheries on several items which have been raised with them.

AAAWA has sent a letter to Recfishwest, for passing on to the Department of Fisheries, listing several problems with the 2013 Recreational Fishing Guide, and associated parts of the Fisheries website and Fish Resources Management Act Regulations.

AAAWA is very concerned about comments in a recent Supreme Court appeal about the poorly constructed regulations for the Fishing from Boat licence.

The rally for the North Beach jetty will be held on 28 April and a good attendance is requested, otherwise the opponents will cite that as a lack of interest from fishermen.

The AAAWA State Boating Championships were held on 16 March and were a great success.

Reel Talk and Club website Up to date. Nothing special to report.

Notices of Motion Notices as published in Reel Talk.

Moved Terry Fuller, seconded John Curtis to amend Competition Rules section 2.4.1 to delete the words "Members who sign on for the Trip Field Day shall receive an additional thirty (30) points for attendance, i.e. total of 40 attendance points." The rule will now read "All members who sign on for a Field Day shall receive ten (10) points for attendance. These will count towards the Field Day top ten points and thus for Sportsperson of the Year points." Carried.

Moved Terry Fuller, seconded Pat McKeown to amend the age in the first sentence of Competition Rules section 3.2.12 from 55 to 60, so that it will now read "A Veteran must be 60 years of age or over at the commencement of the competition year." Carried.

Moved Terry Fuller, seconded Peter Pekaar to amend Competition Rules section 3.3.8 to add the words "and a high visibility vest" so that the rule will read "All markers shall wear protective head gear and a high visibility vest at all times when marking." Carried.

Moved Terry Fuller, seconded Allan Jones to amend the second paragraph of Competition Rules section 3.2.10 by deleting the words "wear safety helmets and" so that it will now read "Markers shall pay special attention when casts are about to be made. Markers must stand to the side of the target area in accuracy events, not behind, and shall stand perfectly still while the cast is being made." Carried.

Rottnest Field Day fishing times

Peet Wessels had sent a letter to the club with a notice of motion to change the recommended fishing times for Rottnest field days. President George Holman said this had topic been debated at length at the March General meeting, and that Peet's earlier letter had been read out. Moved Peet Wessels, seconded Peter Osborne that the topic be debated again, carried.

Moved Peet Wessels, seconded Peter Osborne that for future Rottnest Field Days the times as recommended by the committee are set aside and the field day revert to times of lines down 11am Saturday and lines up 7pm Sunday, with weigh-in to be at 9pm, or for specific individuals as arranged and agreed with the Field Day Officer. The Local Field Day to adhere to these times.

After considerable discussion about the reasons for the committee's recommendations and the increasing costs for the Rottnest field day, the voting was 9 for and 9 against. The President used his casting vote to carry the motion.

Treasurer Terry Fuller reminded the members who intended going to Rottnest that payment needed to be made immediately.

General business George Holman showed some of the rods and reels which had been bought with the Recfishwest small community grant, and also bulk spools of line.

Ron Thomas said he will be away from Perth for four or five months and offered his apologies for meetings.

<u>Annual General Meeting</u> Moved George Holman seconded Peter Pekaar that the club's Annual General Meeting and election of committee be held in September. Many members will be away at the AAA National Championships in the usual month of August. Carried.

2013/2014 Competitions Moved Peter Osborne, seconded Ron Thomas that the field days as listed and amended as above be adopted for the coming season, carried.

Moved Mark Hansen, seconded Peter Osborne that the Open competition and sections be as listed in the Competition Rules for the coming season, carried.

Moved Peter Osborne, seconded Mark Hansen that the dry casting be as listed in the Competition Rules for the coming season with dates as listed in Reel Talk, carried.

<u>Presentation Night</u> President George Holman asked members to consider donations for the Presentation Night to be held in June. He also asked members to buy tickets and fill in their menu forms as soon as possible to help with organising the event.





S-Bend Field Day in June

Have you ever driven that 70 odd kilometre stretch from Dongara to Geraldton, seen the coastal dunes on the western side of the road, and wondered what's over them and what the coast and the fishing is like? Well your chance to find out is coming up.

The June Field Day Saturday/Sunday/Monday 1/2/3 June long weekend will be held at S-Bend, with boundaries from Carson's Beach 15km south of Dongara to the northern end of Coronation Beach, about 25km north of Geraldton.

Saturday and Sunday will also be the AAAWA 2012/13 Rock and Beach Fishing championships. See the separate article on that.

The S-Bend area is another one of those fantastic fishing areas with lots of options for fishing from beaches or from the reefs during low swell, some with deep water close in, using bait or lures. This area is one of the few places there is a chance of catching a WA Dhufish from the shore.

The field days held there are always great with lots of chances to fish with other members, find out what the other people are catching and how. Some times of the year the sea "breeze" wind can be diabolical - those trees beside the road at Greenough aren't bent like that because they are lazy.

But this field day is in winter where the weather can range from calm and beautiful to a full winter gale. It will be another one of those "what you see is what you get."

The swell and weed can be a problem in places and at some times, but that's mid west coast weather and fishing, so make sure you have the right gear and move around to find a safe, clear fishing spot if necessary.

The Instruction period at the May General meeting will cover the S-Bend area, what you can expect for fishing and where you can go both 2 wheel and 4 wheel drive.

In the right conditions, bait casting an unweighted bait is very productive, but that's generally only a small percentage of the time. More often, you have to cast too far or the wind is too strong or swell too high.

Lures are a great option too. The S-Bend coast is ideal for the angler who loves to explore.

Wandering along the kilometres of fishy coast with a reef bag and poppers or metal lures in the early morning or late afternoon opens up a whole lot of country that is impractical to fish with bait. And don't forget the soft plastics.

If you want to do some research on the areas and the roads and tracks, have a look at Google maps http://maps.google.com.au/ and search for Greenough as a starting point.

Click on the "Earth" tab on the top right, zoom in and look at the many tracks and great looking coastline.

The Western Angler website has a great article titled "S-Bend Revisited" by Mike Roennfeldt. It's well worth a read to get your enthusiasm going.

These scores include points for attendance at the April General Meeting. These results have been prepared from the original hand written distances and scores recorded on the day. Robert and Peter Pekaar copied the scores from the score sheets into an electronic format, adjusted the distance scores for the 20 metre measurement setback, and cross checked all final figures against the original score sheets. Terry Fuller used his computer drycasting scoring program to process the results to calculate the points, add all together, sort into final score order, extract the section winners and year's best, and the progressive scores for use at the end of the competition year.

<u>Updated - Dry casting area at Yokine Reserve</u>

When making our booking for Yokine Reserve for the "Winter" season, April to September, the City of Stirling advised it will be upgrading the reticulation at Yokine East from 15 April 2013. Given this, a large portion of the reserve will be unavailable for use by clubs.

I have received an updated map of the area that will be available to our club from May to September 2013, the area shown as Pink on the map.

I have spoken to Karen Balm form City of Stirling. She says the work will be the "once every 20 years" major upgrade of reticulation, and will be very extensive.

Large parts of Yokine Reserve East will be dug up and barricaded off from April to August.

Karen has been instructed not to allocate areas to users until the grounds have had some weeks to recover and are ready for use.

Some soccer has been moved from another reserve to the northern part of Yokine Reserve East, the part not allocated to us, and presumably will be playing on those dates.



Parking. We will need to use the southern end of the car park.

We will need to walk around the southern end of the Reserve to get to the pink area shown for May onwards.

Note that this is over 200 metres from the parking area, so come prepared to carry <u>ALL</u> your gear to the casting area and lock up your car because there won't be any club members near the cars.

Casting towards the north might be too dangerous at some times. Note there are houses to the south of the pink area and a lot of walkers on that south path so it's risky to cast in that direction.

In the worst case we may have to cancel the most risky casting, distance casting, for some months if there are other users to the north or in the direction we would need to cast.

Karen says there are no other areas or date allocations possible. We may have a better idea of the real areas and restrictions month by month.

The Club has booked and paid for those dates. Even if we could go somewhere else for these or some months, (assuming we can find somewhere suitable and available) we should keep the Yokine Reserve booking because we may have difficulty getting an allocation on Yokine Reserve East in future as it seems there may be more applicants than spaces, and we need to keep the Club's record of continuous use.

Field Day report April 2013 Capes South

Fishing spots at the April 2013 Capes South field day were spread from mouth of the Margaret River to Elephant Rock, north of Augusta. Mixed catches resulted from these locations. On driving down on Friday, I had light rain and drizzle all the way, but while speaking to Terry on my mobile phone, he had looked at the Weather Bureau's rain radar which showed rain was further north, and it seemed the rest of that day should be clear. He was spot on, just beautiful field day weather.

The short Safari trip. A team of seven SCAC fisherpersons, Peet and Sandra Wessels, Geoff Raftis, George Holman, Pat McKeown, Dave Maxted and Peter Osborne, participated in this short safari field day event at our southwest coast.

Geoff, George, Dave and Pat had accommodation at Prevelly Park. This location gave them good access to the sign-on and weigh-in location at the intersection from Caves Road to the road down to Prevelly Park.

Peet, Sandra and I went down to Elephant Rock and stayed there overnight.

The fishing time was from 12 noon Saturday 13 April to 12 noon Sunday. Fish captures and different species were reasonable with salmon making an appearance for most.

George Holman caught some herring and a tarwhine and also found a school of quality skippy, bagging out on one day's bag limit. His best fish weighed 0.71kg. Unfortunately George did not hook up on any salmon.

Dave Maxted got a mixed bag of herring, tailor, skippy and tarwhine. He had the best bag of tailor comprising a total of 5 of these.

Geoff also managed a mixed bag of salmon, herring, tailor and skippy. He ended up with the second heaviest bag.

Peet, Sandra and I went down to Elephant Rock. While weather conditions were good, fishing was slow compared to past experiences. Sandra and Peet both got a good snook each fairly early in the afternoon, with me not managing to find one of these.

I went around the corner from Elephant Rock to a spot that I had previous successes in catching skippy. Second cast, I was on with a good skippy, and then a few fair sized herring and a rock blackfish. Wow, this was great, but then a school of mini herring moved in, about

mulie size, could not get past them so I gave up and re-joined Peet and Sandra on top of Elephant Rock.

Shortly after, Peet thought he would try the area I had just left and he managed some herring, rock blackfish and a just undersize leatherjacket. We fished through to until dark, with Peet and Sandra hooking up on large rays and Port Jackson sharks. I decided to quit as in theory the productive time of just before to just after sunset was not actually productive. Peet and Sandra fished on for another hour or so, but only hooked up on more rays and Port Jackson sharks. Back at the cars, we cooked up a meal and then slept in our vehicles, rising just before light on Sunday morning.

The drive out on the track to Caves Road was slow with sections of good firm sand and then washouts. Driving north on Caves road for about 18 km, we found the track that goes down to Hamelin beach. Now that's a real 4WD track. Long drive in with some massive limestone outcrops that you had to go into low gear 4wd and walk the vehicle across these section trying to ensure you would not bottom out.

On arriving on the beach, what a marvelous sight, blue sky with a small amount of woolly white clouds, blue water, 1 to 1.5 metre waves breaking and a very light wind.

Already lots of vehicles on the beach and more followed us in. We drove along the beach at the top where the sand track was firm without letting tires down, looking for waves breaking further out and a gutter formation.

Within a few kilometres we found what looked like a good gutter, hence the 3 of us had lines in the water within minutes.

Sandra immediately hooked up on a tailor. No more of these, think we should have been there last night or very early morning.

Not too long after I hooked up on a very good salmon, 4.5kg cleaned so would have been over 5kg. Shortly after, Sandra hooked up on her salmon. Peet kept trying but no luck on this species; Both Peet and Sandra also tried for herring but were plagued by small undersize fish.



How is that for a big handful of different fish. You can tell from the smile someone was pleased.

Later in the morning I hooked up and landed a second salmon. This made my 3rd salmon in my esky. On the way down on Friday I had tried a couple of places in the Capes North section, and saw salmon being caught. With low swell I used my single handed rod to hook a salmon and was able climb down and with a heavy leader to lift it up onto the rocks, a lot of fun. Lost two before I managed to land on such light gear.

Too quickly time to go back to the weigh-in arrived. I am adding the following into our discussion as it demonstrate what not to do. I did not let air out of my tire and tried to reverse up onto the firm track. Nope, buried the wheels in soft sand. Peet backed over, we hooked up on the snatch trap and when he gave it the gun not enough momentum while still in soft sand and even though he let air out of his tires he buried his wheels.

Dilemma - as the snatch strap was still under elastic tension and we could not let go the shackles as neither vehicle could be moved. Fortunately a stranger came along with an older, but well set up Toyota with big tires and lifters, and he soon got us mobile.

We arrived at weigh-in location with only a minute to spare. I set up tables etc. and as we put the fish across the scales everyone swapped their stories on fish caught. Again, smiles all around.

Sandra took a series of photos, where we had to take care due to spiders and webs from the trees in the background.

Local Field Day. This was held from midday Saturday 13 August to Sunday with the weigh-in at noon at George Holman's house.

Martin Wearmouth and John Crompton fished locally at Floreat. Fish were pretty scarce. John had a couple of good hits but came away empty handed.

Final reflections. I have encountered this sort of Salmon fishing at Bluff Creek, and Esperance. Hamelin Bay beach also provided one of those surreal fishing experiences.

Picture this - imagine sitting on your esky or chair beside your vehicle, enjoying a drink, with weather, the sky, beach and water as painted in above....

And then you hear Sandra screaming at you (Sandra is good at vocalizing)

As you look up you see your rod bent in a beautiful arc and as you walk down to your rod at the water's edge, about 40 metres from the shore, out of the ocean a salmon jumps high and spins with water streaming off his back, glistening silver and white from the sun.

Walk down and pick up the rod, with sand and lapping water between your toes and with controlled care you proceed to play and land a 5+ kg fish. Can it get any better? Doesn't always happen but Surfcasters provides opportunities to fish at places to give you this experience, so give it serious thought for our forthcoming field days. Cannot be guaranteed, but when it happens it's magic.

Deposits and payments for Rottnest Field days

The following is an updated extract from an article first published on page 31 of the September 2010 Reel Talk.

To secure a place for Rottnest Field days, you need to pay a deposit of \$100 for each person for each of the field days you want to attend. You are encouraged to pay these deposits as soon as possible, but not later than 4 months before the start of the Field day.

People who have paid deposits will be advised of the expected total cost. The outstanding amount needs to be paid not later than 1 month before the start of the field day. This will also be the cut-off date when a decision has to be made if we will cancel part or all of the booked

accommodation should we run low in numbers. The standard Rottnest cancellation fee per booked unit will apply for cancellations earlier than 14 days before the arrival date.

Any cancellation will have an impact on cost as the accommodation and bus transport costs will need to be split between the remainder of the members.

Should we get an early interest and we receive more deposits than we have booked accommodation for, we will do our best to get more accommodation booked, however there is a high demand for accommodation at Rottnest.

We will allocate accommodation in the order of how deposits were paid, first come first served. Priority will be given to Club members over visitors if needed.

Deposits paid by members will not be refunded after the cutoff date unless someone else takes their place and pays in full.

Please note that the August 2013 Field day for Rottnest will be on 17/18 August, the usual weekend after the General meeting, not the date wrongly advised in the March and April Reel Talks.

Notices of motion have been given for the following changes to section 76 of the AAAWA Constitution, removing the struck out words and adding the words in italics.

- (d) A list will be kept in a State Records Book of all current State Records and copies thereof are to be distributed throughout the state at 3 monthly intervals for the information of all anglers at the cost of The Association. a copy of the Public Chart is to be placed on the Association web site and amended from time to time as records are updated.
- (f) Any State dry casting record must be cast under AAA State rules at an AAA recognised event, which includes affiliated Club casting events, provided that written notice has been given to the Association at least 30 days prior to the event.

Add a new Section 76 (h) Where a current State drycasting record is equalled, a certificate shall be issued to the claimant indicating that the State drycasting record has been equalled. Only the name of the original record holder shall be kept in the State dry casting record chart.

These changes will be voted on at the May Delegates' meeting.

New fish identification guide


A new fish and species identification guide has been published by the Department of Fisheries

Member John Lee says: "So sorry to hear of Eric's death. I think George had informed me a while back that he was not well.


I remember him fondly, mainly from my very early days with the club.

Revision of Club's Constitution

I have an action point on me by the Committee to draft a revised, rewritten version of the Club's Constitution. I have already started this. Completing it will be quite a job, will take a lot of effort, will take at least several months to complete, and needs to be fitted in with all my other commitments for the Club and personally.

Any new Constitution needs to be approved by the Department of Commerce. Their requirements have been tightened up a lot in recent years. In particular there are specific requirements for giving Notice of Special Resolution for the changes to be voted on and accepted at a specified meeting, and the short time allowed for any changes to be accepted and approved by the Department and for which fees must be paid.

As members know, discussing complex things like Constitutions at meetings can take up an enormous amount of time. People can have many possible comments about the way things are worded, as well as what is actually specified by a document.

Members' comments in the past have included not wanting to spend their meeting time on "boring administrative stuff". There is sometimes also a problem of keeping these discussions on the topic.

The way I propose to do this job is to draft a new plain English version based on our current Constitution and the requirements of the Department of Commerce. I will then get the Committee's comments for changes, and eventually an "in principle" approval for some new version.

This will be doing most of the hard work and I hope this will produce a really good workable version before requiring the members to get involved. However as I always do, I will let the members know what we are doing and make available copies of the draft versions, and any member who wants to get involved can get involved.

I will then present the Committee's agreed draft version to the members and ask for their comments and suggestions for any changes.

I would like most of this to be done by email, telephone or letter or outside of meetings.

If there are different opinions about some parts, I expect that members will move and vote on motions to change some parts of the draft proposed Constitution. This process will continue until we have a version that everybody is happy with, or at least is prepared to accept. These agreed changes would go into the 'final' proposed version.

I want to make it clear that we are doing it this way not because the Committee wants to control this, but simply to save everybody the hassles of using up lots of meeting time, having lots of discussions and needing to keep track of the changes from version to version.

That means members really need to take the time to think about the final draft version when it is presented so that all of their questions are answered before we get to the time we have to make a formal decision.

Only then will I give Notice of Special Resolution and nominate a formal meeting for the members to formally accept that version of the Constitution as the club's new Constitution.

Ideally that formal meeting would be short because all of the work would have already been done.

Of course, even then, any member will still have the right to propose last minute changes. But I hope that members will not do that because they have taken the time to be sure that all their questions have already been answered and not leave it to the night of that formal meeting, because that will just waste everybody's time.

All that members need to do now is let me know about any parts of the Constitution they think need to be changed.

Winners of Ken Matthews trophy

One of the action points on me from the July 2012 Committee meeting was to list all winners of the Ken Matthews trophy and the Sportsperson of the Year for getting replacement trophies.

The winners of the Sportsperson of the Year from 1959/60 to 2010/11 were listed in the May 2012 Reel Talk. The original trophy has been missing for some time, and it is intended to get a new trophy with all the winners names on it and with space for many more years.

The Ken Matthews trophy is for the heaviest scale fish caught on Field days in the first and second six months of each competition year. So far there are 118 engraved shields, the base has been extended a couple of times, and there is only room for another year after this current year. The Cup and many of the shields are in poor condition with tarnished, worn through or missing plating. It is intended to get a replacement trophy with all the winners names on it and with space for many more years.

I have spent quite some time going through the copies of past Reel Talks and now have a list from 1955/6 to 2012/13 of the winner's name, the fish caught, where it was caught, the month and the Competition Year. We are missing many Reel Talks from the 1950s, so I haven't been able to get all the details for those years, but do have the winner and the fish and the competition year which were engraved on the trophy.

There are some great catches and memories in that list. I will print the full 2½ page list in a future Reel Talk.

Reef and rock shoes

I came across an interesting safety item in an email newsletter from the Recreational Fishing Alliance of NSW (email info@rfansw.com.au) saying:

"Bart from Griprox (their motto 'Leave a mark not a plaque') was on hand recently at some of our rock fishing safety workshops to help us push the safe fishing messages and promote GripRox rock fishing shoes. So we don't mind giving them a free plug for a great product that could save lives."

NSW has a sad history of drownings while rock fishing, and the safety messages are being pushed out including wearing suitable footwear. WA also has preventable drownings, too many caused by slipping into the water. See the article on page 26 of the March 2013 Reel Talk for WA's plans about rock and reef fishing safety.

These shoes are really "overshoes" made up of a silicone rubber upper part linked by stainless steel chains to plates on the soles, each shoe with 17 teeth to grip the rocks. You need your own shoes as well.

The rock type in lots of NSW fishing spots is sandstone, which is relatively soft, similar to our limestone, and quite different to the very hard and sloping granite of our southwest and south coasts.

I haven't yet seen any review of the effectiveness of these shoes on hard granite, but it doesn't seem like there would be any problem if they are properly fitted to suitable shoes that grip your feet well, and are used sensibly.

Many club members use Mirage Rock Hopper boots or similar, which are really great for reef and rock fishing because they also support your ankles very well and give great grip on the rocks. A local WA tackle store currently has these for \$50 which is a great price for such an important safety item.



Whatever rock boots are used, the spikes will eventually wear away and will need to be sharpened or replaced, particularly if they are used on hard rocks.




