APRIL FIELD DAY

The Field Day to Garden Island in April 1965 has been deffered for one week until the 24th and 25th of April 1965.

The reason for this alteration is that the normal weekend (i.e. following the General Meeting) will fall on Easter next year and as many members would have other arrangements the change was considered in the best interests of all.

RAFFLE

The Xmas Hampers Raffle books are to be posted out to all members this week. As they are somewhat later being distributed this year than last year, the necessity for members to sell their books quickly must be stressed.

All books must be sold and returned by the December General Meeting and if everyone makes a similar effort to our raffle last year, they will be the ones to benefit.

DRY CASTING - 4TH OCTOBER, 1964.

Our drycasting day started out to be a fairly good day but before we had finished our three events, a strong southerly wind was upsetting our casting somewhat. Nevertheless 27 seniors and 2 juniors participated and luckily we only had a few drops of rain.

The D.H. Accuracy events of 90 yards and 60 yards proved very troublesome to most members only three scoring with all four casts. They were Allan Bunnett, Bob Tucker and Ken Jones. These distances are the second longest we cast to, the longest distance in the competition is 92 yards. Bob Tucker won this event with 45/80, Noel Knight was second with 40/80 and Allan Bunnett was third with 37/80.

The S.H. Accuracy was also very troublesome and the only person worthy of mention in this event was Bob Tichbon who scored all four casts to win with 20/40.

Bill Bridger sent one down the lane 420ft. in the L.L. Distance event, Allan Bunnett 411ft. and Ken Jones 373ft. Ken was a little unlucky in this event as he lost his sinker somewhere along the way on one of his casts. Don Beadon put three casts straight down the middle to win this event with 310 - 153 - 463. Bill Bridger was second with 383 - 68 - 451 and Allan Bunnett third with 375 - 74 - 44. There were only seven members who did not incur a penalty of 21ft. for every cast outside the lane.

JUNIORS

Don Bridger and Noel Knight Jnr. were the only juniors casting. Don top scored in all events with 37/80 D.H. Accuracy and 21/40 S.H. Accuracy and established a new L.L. Distance record casting 333ft. breaking Rick Jensen's record of 324ft.

FIELD DAY - MOORE RIVER - 18TH & 19TH OCTOBER, 1964

Weather conditions:- Strong southerly winds, water deeply stained with the river out flow. Most of the lads had one glance and when Ledge Point was included in the venue, they headed in that direction. Good attendance, 41 members, 3 junior members plus 2 visitors at the venue (46). The local venues are always very popular and even though the fish were absent, several good captures were made. Pleased to see Bertie Payne, Frank Van Zolan, Henry Bester, not forgetting Noel Knight (who has returned to the fold.) Keith Martin, Gerry Windus, () Lilly and Snow Tate.

On arrival at Moore River, camp was set up and we found Les Tate and Norm Giles gloomily discussing the blackish water. Bob Klein, Ron Shirley, Ron Kildahl had decided to give it a go anyway, keeping in mind the likely Mulloway which may be lurking around the shore line. Bob Jensen and Bill Utting also decided to battle on through the dirty ocean water. Don Webb journeyed up to the Ledge Point area and returned later in the afternoon reporting that the area was very shallow and not to his liking. Andy Mulgrave and Noel Knight had a look around at the Moore River area and promptly returned to Ledge Point followed by Allan Bunnett and Arch. Ticklie. Arthur Horton, Bob Tichbon, Norm Clark also followed a little later in the afternoon to be joined by Bob Tucker, Tom Smith, Hugh Gregory and Bob Lilly.

Back on the main beach, Jack Harvey carried our rods etc. down to the beach where Don Webb was the first angler to have a strike and a small Mulloway was the result. Bill Utting, Garry Davidson, Bob Jensen and Ken Hunt were also on the job and landed a Tailor each and at this time events looked quite interesting. Doug Talbot recorded a strike and with the assistance of Eric Sullivan who gaffed the shark soon had it high and dry. Phil Neri, not to be out of it, also received a decent strike and after a few hectic minutes landed a Mulloway which tipped the scales at 8³/₄ lbs.

Alas! the Tailor moved onwards and as the time dragged by even the Mulloway disappeared, no doubt shaken by the loss of one of its members. In the meantime the lads from the Ledge Point area were also searching in vain for the Tailor etc. Bertie Payne and Henry

Bester walked north, near the Point and Bertie battled with a huge ray approximately 50lbs. and finally landed same. Bertie was just blown out. Though once again no Mulloway or Tailor Henry said he had a wow of a time watching Bertie in action. Hal Neil was observed casting far and wide near the river mouth without any success. Ron Shirley's party reported no strikes even though they had chosen an excellent position.

Most of the lads retired about 10.30 or so and all rose early hoping the Tailor would come along the shore line. Came the dawn and the anglers were all on the ready, casting far and wide though once again the Tailor failed to show. A school of Herring aroused a little interest and Phil Neri and Jack Harvey landed several. The swell made blob fishing rather difficult, though not as bad as the previous evening. Sunday morning the breeze swung round to the north east - fine and warm. In the meantime we had been wondering how the lads from the Ledge Point area had been faring. However the fish from this area were very scarce and small mainly chopper size, and so the overall weight remained very light.

So closed another field day and to the award winners go my congratulations - again they were certainly hard earned. Many thanks to all my helpers on the venue, not forgetting Horrie Muirson taking the photos for the Club album.

With our next outing scheduled for the Jurien Bay - North Head area on the November long weekend, our tally of fish should now show a great improvement and it is hoped that a good roll up of members will take the opportunity of journeying to this new venue.
