DRY CASTING NEWS. OCTOBER 1965.

Twenty three members and a junior attended this month's dry casting eventsheld at the Floreat Park oval. Wintry conditions may have kept some of the boys away, but with the promise of warmer weather, we hope to see a few more of the lads supporting these events. Accuracy in casting helps the fisherman to land his baits in the right 'spot'.

A slight delay occured when the gates were found locked but it was not long before the events were in progress. The longest cast in the level line distance was made by K. Jones 423 ft. followed by W. Bridger 416 ft. and A. Bunnett 390 ft. The winner of this event was B. Hanks 314-180-494, second place to D. Clegg, 344-148-492, and third was B. Utting 376-115-491.

The D.H. Accuracy was set at 66 yards and 46 yards. Quite a few of the boys found with the shorter distances that they were over-casting the targets. The results were first R. Jensen with 52/80, followed by N. Cross and T. Smith with 51/80, and third was W. Bridger with 46/80. N. Cross scored a near miss and only eight members scored with all four casts.

The targets for the S.H. Accuracy were set at 136 ft. and 106 ft., these being the maximum for this year. There were only five members who scored with their first cast on the 136 target, but members soon settled down to this challenge and gave better performances in their second cast. The winner was R. Tichbon with 29/40, I McLennan second with 19/40, and R. Tucker and R. Jensen third with 18/40. Only two members scored with all four casts.

Out of the eight casts in the accuracy, two members scored with all eight casts, R. Tichbon and B. Utting. Overall winner for the day was B. Utting first with 96 points, D. Talbot second with 94 points, and A. Bunnet third with 92 points.

Drycasting new continued.

There were no records broken, and six members reduced their handicaps.

Rule 9. Drycasting Rules.

All events will be contested with - Standard fishing gear using level line throughout. (Line of the same gauge or breaking strain - no heavier leaders allowed). Any infringement of this rule will subject the offender to loss of all points for that day's casting, and he will forfeit his right to complete the programme.

REVISION OF HANDICAPS

Handicaps are revised every six months using the best cast from the last six casting days attended in previous twelve months period. Average subtracted from base figure of 450 equals handicap.

Maximum handicap for Senior 180, Junior 270.
