The October meeting was attended by 24 delegates of affiliated clubs at the Dept. Youth, Sport and Recreation, Perry Lakes. Club delegate attending: George Holman.

Drycasting Officer reported on forthcoming State Open Drycasting to be run by the Surfcasters and expressed disappointment at the number of entries, particularly in view of the excellent work put into the event by the organising club.

It was moved and carried that any monies received from grants to State teams going away next year to the Australian Convention be divided

equally between team members and officials.

It was moved by the State Team Captain for the 1981 Convention in South Australia, John Butler, that the W.A. Division supply \$3000 towards the cost of sending the team away. The motion was carried 9-7.
