
MEETINGS

Entries for Game Fish Badge, Club Records and Open Fishing Competitions must be lodged with the recorder within 30 days of capture.





MUSSELS- A LA SHARON

INGREDIENTS:
1kq mussels

1 large tin vegetable juice

1 onion, sliced

2 sticks of celery sliced

1 carrot sliced thinly or in julienne strips

Worchester sauce to taste

Chilli sauce (optional)

Salt and pepper (crushed peppercorns are best)

Herbs to suit (eq. basil, chives)

1 bay leaf

Small amount of garlic granules.

METHOD: ~

Soak mussels in large pot of cold water. Remove the beards from mussels. Discard any mussels that don't close by themselves.

Saute onions in small amount of butter. Add celery and bay leaf. Add tin of vegetable juice, worchester sauce, seasonings. Bring to boiling point.
Add mussels cover and heat gently until mussels are open.

Serve with bown bread and a green salad. Servies 2-4, depending on how much you like mussels.
