Field Days

Peter Osborne reported briefly on the Port Gregory field day and AAAWA Rock and Beach championships at Port Gregory, as reported in the October Reel Talk.

Ken Howells gave some details of the September local Field day at which they saw several pink snapper caught but the North mole was crowded out with anglers.

Arrangements for the coming Cervantes field day are covered in Reel Talk. Any questions can be answered by contacting the Field Day Officer.

Peter Osborne reminded members of the demersal closure period during which species such as pink snapper cannot be kept.

Dry Casting Ron Thomas said October dry casting had not yet been run.

AAAWA State dry casting championships will be held on 26 October. Ron has entry forms which need to completed and be back to him by Sunday 12 October.

As covered in the October Reel Talk, the Club can't have Yokine Reserve on Sunday 7 December due to a booking for a Tee Ball Carnival. City of Stirling have booked us Sunday 14 December which is listed for the Field day. Terry Fuller has checked and Yokine Reserve is still available on 30 November.





Recorder's report

My Recorder's report in the October Reel Talk was completed just the week before printing and most has been covered in that .

You will see from the Reel Talk that a policy has been written and accepted by Committee covering Species and Masters badges.

The policy is aimed at giving members the greatest possible chance of their having catches counted towards these badges, by counting all catches while a member of the Club.

Members can let me know about any of their catches already recorded by the Club which may be eligible but are not already listed.

Before 2001, details of species and weights of fish caught on Field days were not often recorded in Reel Talk.

Members may be wondering about my suggestion of allocating catches first to the Masters badge even though they may be heavy enough to be eligible for Grand Masters.

That proposal is so that members have a greater chance of getting one badge.

Even so, if a later catch of that species is eligible for a Masters then that will replace the heavier one which will then be counted for a Grand masters.

Those are only suggestions and each member is free to ask to have a catch counted for a different badge if it is eligible.

Geoff Raftis has caught a black bream on a hand line at Stokes Inlet on the South Coast. The Committee has agreed to an estimated weight of 0.6kg, and this fish has been entered for a Species and Grand Masters badge, and in section 15 of the Open fishing competition.

<u>Club fishing record updated.</u> I have checked Peet Wessels' scales used to weigh his magnificent tailor caught at Bremer Bay, as reported in the October Reel Talk.

Peet's scales read a little low compared to the Club's 15kg digital scales, so his tailor weighed a little more than he thought. I have put it in as the Club record tailor at 6.30kg.

Please take at least one photo of your fish against a ruler, but if that's not available, against something common which is a known size, eg a drink can.

If you only have a can please also take some photos without including the can, suitable for publication.

AAAWA Notice of Motion - membership of teams

Notice of Motion was given by George Holman at the 16 September AAAWA Delegates' meeting. It will be voted on at the November Delegates' meeting.

I give notice of a motion: "that a person representing the State of WA at AAA National Championships may decline to be nominated as a member of some particular team; and may instead nominate to be, and compete for WA as, part of a team made up of eligible persons of their choice."

George Holman read the following at the October AAAWA Delegates' meeting

We should respect that people who are willing to spend their own money to represent the State of WA at AAA National Championships be given the choice of who they want to compete with. It is called "freedom of choice."

Team members need to travel, share accommodation, train and use their leisure time together, and compete and cooperate as a team to get the best possible results.

There are a number of people who have been representing this State for many years, as far back as 1975 at Albany, 1983 at Ballina, and 1985 at Bunbury up to the current time.

There are also a number of people who have had a very short involvement and others have had a long period of absence.

People may have their reasons for being selective, and they must be given that choice as they are supposed to be members of a team.

Teams need to work together from the commencement of planning until completion of the events.

They need to have a voice and be able to enjoy the comradery and the experience at the level they want to compete at.

They should have input into the selections of the State Captain, team members, and team captains and planning in general.

Club members who intend to compete in the National AAA Championships in future should consider this motion and discuss their thoughts with the Delegates from this Club.

Note that this motion, if passed at the November AAAWA Delegates' meeting, will give competitors rights of choice about who will be on the same team as they are. It will not give the right to prevent someone being selected for a team, but the right to say they don't want to be on a team with some people and instead to form a separate, extra team.

It's November already. Preferably **before** the April General Meeting, we need to set the fishing Field Day venues, boundaries and dates for the May 2015 to April 2016 club competition year.

Drycasting dates can be shifted to avoid field days, subject to getting a booking for Yokine Reserve. The Club does <u>not</u> have and <u>cannot</u> now get any permanent booking for Yokine Reserve. Bookings are only accepted by the City of Stirling for the "summer" sporting season, October to March, and the "winter" sporting season April to September, each arranged about 2 months before the start of each "season."

We would like to publish a possible list, or at least a list of the suggestions, in the February Reel Talk, have some discussion at the February General Meeting, and then finalise the list at the February Committee meeting for the March Reel Talk, to be voted on by the members at the March General Meeting. That gives us a month spare to sort out any difficulties and means we are not forced to make a decision at the last minute at the April General Meeting.

Anything is possible, different / new venues, different formats, different rules, whatever, if the members will support them by going on those Field Days.

If you have any ideas, please put your suggestions in to the Committee, and list the venues on the coloured form included with this Reel Talk.

You are requested to nominate only those months and venues that you have a reasonable expectation of attending. These could be choices from local, close venues, or distant venues. Distant venues are generally tied to long weekends.

The Committee will use this information to recommend a set of venues that attracts and gives the greatest interest and potentially maximize attendance by Club members.

<u>DO IT NOW, PLEASE!!!</u> The current Competition Rules are available from the Secretary or see the club's web site http://www.surfcasters.iinet.net.au/ for the online versions.

We don't want to have all the discussions and all the changes at the last minute at the April General Meeting. That's not the way to make good decisions.

Our Field Day Officer will update this year's details into his spreadsheet that summarizes catches etc. over the past few years and will hand it out at the December General Meeting. This is offered as a guide to help in nominating venues, but noting it is your choice that drives the final selection. The committee takes your written submissions and together with the discussions/agreements at the February General Meeting, makes up a list that captures the best selection from all of the nominated and agreed venues etc.

At the following meeting, this listing is then voted in by club members. Hence, the listing that is voted in should be a selection that best suits all of the anglers that attend our away field days. Please note, also to be voted in is a local field day run in parallel with the away field day.

From previous years it is noted that a balance is sought between venues that are reasonably close (say 2 hour drive) to longer distances (say up to 4 hour drive) and to have one or two safari type venues over a long weekend such as Esperance, Bluff Creek, or Kalbarri.

The Committee also will examine any new ideas, or lateral thinking that could improve our fishing enjoyment. For those fisherpersons who attend our field days please give this process some thought and put forward your personal preferences and any further ideas.



October 2014 fishing field day

Synopsis. The October 2014 field day was spread from Jurien to Cervantes with members fishing the Hill River area, and South Point at Jurien. Despite storm warnings and severe conditions in Perth on Saturday, all weather conditions at this venue were good, however only small catches were made with the bulk of catches being the odd chopper tailor and herring.

Three members advised they would sign on, with two persons actually fishing locally with one outstanding fish being landed.

The away venue gave pleasant fishing conditions with most getting a small feed of fish. For the field day the team that went away plenty of smiles and kidding about things that went right or wrong.

<u>The trip.</u> The sign on at the Cervantes Service Station was at 12:30 pm Saturday 18 October with lines down at 2pm with fishing through until Sunday 19 October with the usual lines up at 10am and the weigh-in conducted at 11:30am at the sign-on location.

A total of 8 SCAC anglers and 2 juniors came to the away sign-on. Martin Wearmouth and sons Christian and Thomas, Gary Parkinson, Ken Howells, Ray Walker, Glen Wong, Peter Osborne and new members Peter Butland and Mark Nurse.

Ray Walker came up on Friday and set up camp at the mouth of the river. He fished hard on Friday evening and despite strong winds and the threat of a storm he managed some tailor. Came Saturday he could not find any tailor but found plenty of small tarwhine with only one being legal size. Ray also put out live baits hoping for a big fish. No such luck only to see Martin pull in beside him and get a shark.

From the photo, see a good example of Ray's very efficient small camp. Ray's set up is based on his little Suzuki 4WD with a fold out canopy with attached walls to make an enclosed tent space. This set-up gives a very comfortable protected space for sleeping, cooking meals, and relaxing in the shade.

The group of Gary Parkinson, Ken Howells, Peter Butland and Mark Nurse arrived late Friday and drove to the mouth of the river setting up camp at the river mouth just on the north and inside of the sand dune, at the time not then realizing that Ray was round the corner on the south west side of the sand dune.

Also refer to photos of how this group set up camp, noting that they employed sleeping swags. Ken also had a roll out canopy on his vehicle to give protection from sun. Good quality swags give good rain protection, are not greatly affected by strong winds and are a great efficient way to set up a sleeping area without the inconvenience of carrying, setting up, and dismantling a large bulky tent.

While they did not fish Friday evening they fished hard on Saturday afternoon and evening.

Tailor were very scarce with Ken, Peter and Mark getting a couple of chopper tailor each with the odd herring also caught.

Mark also persevered on Sunday morning and caught a couple more chopper tailor. Mark, (like our other South African members), put in a lot of time and effort and looks like he will be a competent and competitive club fisherperson.

Of course the hard luck story goes to Gary. He could not find tailor but as it got dark he landed a nice herring. Subsequently he decided to put this fish in his esky. On picking up his bucket, with lid on top and the fish resting on top of the lid then walking 50 metres back to the vehicles on arriving the fish was not on the bucket lid. Despite big torches, group searches etc. this fish could not be found. Don't know of any past club field days where people catch fish eligible for weigh-in and then throw them away – good one Gary.

Of course have to report on a purported infringement of rights on this group by Peter Osborne and Glen Wong. Peter and Glen arrived at the mouth of the river just as it started to get light. They noted some SCAC vehicles parked near the river and commented to each other this group appeared to be a sleepy lot and drove past and proceeded to set up rod holders in the sand (there was no indication that people were fishing this stretch of sand,) and started fishing accordingly. Thirty minutes later Mark walked across and started fishing some 20 metres north of Peter and Glen.

Over an hour later or possibly closer to two, Peter B, Gary and Ken staggered out of their camp and of course immediately accused us of taking their fishing spot. Hence suggestion to all club members while it may be safer to take rods back to the camp if parked some distance away, if you want to continue fishing there in the morning, leave the rod sand spikes in place. Note that in our club if there is any opportunity to needle or tease another club member it is par for the course. Gary, Ken and Peter B. are masters of this skill and applied it to the maximum for the perceived infringement.

Martin Wearmouth and sons had organized some accommodation down at Cervantes. After sign-on they went to the mouth of the river using a plan based on some fishing they had on a holiday a couple of weeks earlier. On this occasion they caught fish, in particular bream in the river mouth, although many were undersize. The action was nothing like their earlier trip with only a couple of undersize bream being caught by the boys and Martin. However Martin did manage to add to his species list with one of his bream being a 28 cm specimen.

As this area was not working well, Martin and his boys decided to shift to the point about a kilometre south of the Hill River car park. On arriving they found a family had set up in the area he usually fishes so he returned to the mouth of the river again. Martin set up between Ray and Peter B and shortly after he hooked a ray (not the Ray Walker kind) but the one with a real sting in its tail.

Shortly after this he hooked into a 5kg bronze whaler shark, much to the disgust of Ray. Again much to the disgust of Ray, Martin also managed a couple of tailor, including the biggest tailor of the field day being a 1kg fish.

He and the boys returned to Cervantes for their sleep and got up early next morning to fish the sandy point on the south side of Cervantes. Martin only managed to add one more chopper tailor to his bag. With his shark Martin managed to get the best bag of fish for the away field day.

<u>Peter and Glen's story.</u> From the 2pm start on Saturday they endured a frustrating start to fishing. Peter and Glen fished the north side of the Jurien Marina to catch blowie after blowie. Trying inside the Marina gave the same result. Later that afternoon they then moved to the south side of the dog beach point to the south side of Jurien.

Expectation was high based on past Peter's experience with catching good bags of quality tailor at this location in late afternoon and early evening. Of course Glen had been pumped up on this expectation of getting a bag of tailor.

First hour was guiet with only one good whiting caught by Glen and Peter getting one herring.

Peter's excitement was countered during this time with bite-offs and pulling onto the beach a large north west blowie. The latter gave a further bit of excitement in that this animal actually bit through the hooks when the rod was fully loaded up pulling the fish onto the beach resulting in the sinker and one hook remaining come flying through the air. Peter ducked but the rig was high over his head and flew some 20 metres behind to hit his 4WD vehicle.

With late afternoon coming to a close no tailor appeared. Just before dark Glen moved to the other side of Peter and with good skill levels experienced some success. To Peter's frustration in having no bites, Glen managed to catch in short succession another whiting, a tailor, herring, pike, and a tarwhine, a good species cross section of fish to start his bag of fish.

Like the team at the river mouth we all fished hard until about 10pm. The storm, thunder and lightning was south of us but looked quite alarming and seemed to be coming closer, so we gave up at this time as it looked as though we might be affected by it. Fortunately this did not happen, only well to the south of us copped the storm. While there was only a few drops of rain, Peter and Glen had rooms at the Apex camp accommodation so did not have to worry about the storm.

<u>Sunday morning.</u> Getting up at 4am they proceeded to the mouth of the river where they knew the rest of Surfcasters were fishing. On arriving just as it started to get light they noted the absence of any of Surfcasters out and about so they set up their rods where Peter had previously fished successfully. From 5:30 to 9am, Peter managed to get 4 chopper tailor and a couple more herring. As noted above Mark caught a couple of tailor hence it was noted fish caught were over a nearly 3 hour period on a spasmodic hook-up basis rather than finding a hot bite on schools of these fish.

Glen fished hard that morning, but only managed one chopper tailor. He threw out a couple of burley bombs, resulting in Glen landing a small Stingray. A couple of families doing some 4WD touring had arrived so Glen was able to demonstrate his fishing prowess to a large audience. Some young girls cheered when Glen did not just the catch but undertook a successful release of the ray.

A tarwhine Peter also landed looked as though it would be legal as initial measurement gave 25 cm. On checking before weighing it had shrunk and was a good one cm undersize. Hence a reminder to all, if fish are just size when caught, they need to be remeasured before putting across the scales. While tailor and herring don't tend to shrink, tarwhine, bream and in particular flathead can shrink over a 12 hour period. Keeping fish moist and on ice does help minimize this effect.

<u>Local fishing.</u> Local fishos consisted of George Holman, Pat McKeown and Craig Forward. Given the conditions, a fine capture was made by George. Their story goes along these lines:

George Holman and Pat McKeown signed on locally to fish their usual spots, as did a visitor to our last meeting. Craig Forward had advised that he would fish the North Mole, but shortly after he arrived the storm moved in and as it was so severe he gave up and went home.

George and Pat went to their spot at the local beach north of City Beach. Shortly after they met up, that storm arrived and from a start of heavy rain it quickly turned to hail.

So heavy and with thunder and lightning they left their gear on the beach and ran up the dunes to find shelter and eventually huddled under a bush in these dunes. When conditions calmed down they returned to their fishing gear on the beach. With lightning still about they decided not to hold their rods and put them on beach rod holders and huddled down beside them.

With only a short period of fishing on Saturday evening Pat managed a herring and a flathead. George managed a couple of tailor (larger end of chopper size), a herring and a couple of size tarwhine and to his delight he emulated his mulloway catch of August with a good mulloway, not as big but at 5.41kg cleaned it was a great catch. With very low numbers of fish caught and small sizes of fish for the overall field day results we have an unusual situation that the local field day champion, George, ended up with the heaviest fish, the heaviest bag and the highest point score total.

Based on the SCAC scoring system, fish capture results and the top scores are listed below in Reel Talk. Everyone was pleased that they at least had a feed if only a one meal bag of fish. However bag sizes were well down on expectations for the away venue although six different species of fish came across the weigh-in table at Cervantes. Local fishos had more success for the short time they fished with five species across the scales at their weigh-in.

Hope to see you at our November field day at the same venue. There are high expectations that this time it will really fire with schools of quality tailor and other miscellaneous species showing up at the usual spots we fish.

A newbie report, September field day Port Gregory

they were fishing at track 11. I didn't hear him say that - I still think he was worried about me catching more fish than him and gave me a bum steer. Only joking George.

The second meeting was the meeting prior to the Kalbarri area Field Day. At the meeting there was a lot of talk going on about the trip and the local fishing and I was starting to get some idea of what was going on. Fortunately someone gave me a Reel Talk and after reading this I certainly understood better. I would like to take this opportunity and mention what a very informative and presented newsletter. Hats off to the editor.

I thought to myself this would be a great trip to go on to learn the ropes and cut my teeth, so to speak. I was really looking forward to climbing into the swag that night and trying out the set up and also a good test for future trips. Once again this proved to be a great set up, and very comfortable, mainly because I had the existing swag mattress about 50mm thick and then I placed a single bed mattress inside the swag as well. It was also a double swag so there was plenty of room. The senior members of *your*, soon to be *our*, fishing club said the set up was great.

On the second day I finally got my act together and joined George, Dave, Terry, Pat, Dean, Martin and Ray down on the beach. We fished a spot known to the locals as Nobby's Hole. Don't ask me who Nobby is and what his association with this hole is, but that's the name they told us. During this first evening fishing session I caught my first fish with the club, (many more to come.) A picture of this proud fisherman (me) is in the last copy of the Reel Talk.

Club policy - Recognition of Club records

The following Policy was adopted at the September Committee meeting.

The Club keeps records for fish captures and dry casting distances and accuracy scores by members of the Club.

All applications for records must be approved by the Club.

Applicants must be financial members of the Club at the time.

Members may apply to the Committee and request approval for a non Club event to be declared eligible for Club records.

Records exceeded. Generally a new record is awarded to the first member to exceed the previous / current record.

A new record and a certificate is awarded to the member, and is added to the list of current records.

Shared records. For records exceeded at Club or other approved eligible fishing field days or dry casting days, if two or more members exceed the previous record at the same event on the same calendar day, then they will jointly share the record.

For records exceeded at other than eligible Club events, for example, the Open fishing competition, members' fish captures of equal weights caught on the same calendar day will jointly share the record.

Records equaled. In accordance with common practice in many sports, new captures or scores on a later date which equal but do not exceed the current record do not replace the current record, and those details are not recorded in record lists.

However the Club will acknowledge the equaling of a current record with a certificate presented to the member, and will publish the details in the Club's magazine.

- Respect the rights and worth of every person, regardless of their age, race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexuality or religion.
- Respect the decisions of officials, instructors and administrators.
- Comply with the Club's Policy on unaccompanied juniors at Club events.
- Display appropriate and responsible behaviour in all interactions.
- Display responsible behaviour in relation to alcohol and other drugs.
- Act with integrity and objectivity, and accept responsibility for your decisions and actions.
- Ensure your decisions and actions contribute to a safe environment.
- Ensure your decisions and actions contribute to a harassment-free environment.
- Do not tolerate abusive, bullying or threatening behaviour.
- · Give your best at all times.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- Play by the rules and show respect for other members, instructors and officials.

Instructors

- Place the safety and welfare of the members above all else.
- Help each person (member, official, etc.) to reach their potential. Respect the talent, developmental stage and goals of each person and encourage them with positive and constructive feedback.
- Ensure that any physical contact with another person is appropriate to the situation and necessary for the person's skill development.

Officials

- Place the safety and welfare of the members above all else.
- Ensure all members are included and can participate, regardless of their race, gender, ability, cultural background, sexuality or religion.
- Be consistent, impartial and objective when making decisions.
- · Address unsporting behaviour and promote respect for other members and officials.

Administrators

- Ensure quality supervision and instruction for members.
- Support instructors and officials to improve their skills and competencies.
- Act honestly, in good faith and in the best interests of the sport as a whole.
- Ensure that any information acquired or advantage gained from the position is not used improperly.
- Conduct club responsibilities with due care, competence and diligence.

Parents

- Encourage your child to participate, do their best and have fun.
- Focus on your child's effort and performance, rather than winning or losing.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Help out the instructor or officials at training and games, where possible.
- Model appropriate behaviour, including respect for other members and officials.

Spectators

- Respect the effort and performances of members and officials.
- Reject the use of harassment, bullying or violence in any form, whether by other spectators, instructors, officials or members.


