DRY CASTING - 6TH SEPTEMBER, 1964.

25 seniors and 3 juniors turned out on Father's Day to participate in the days casting at Floreat Park. The best casts in the L.L. Distance were made by Bill Bridger 426ft., Allan Bunnett 384ft. and Bob Tucker 381ft. This event was won by Dennis Rodgers with 279 - 180 - 459, a much improved caster. Eric Sullivan was second with 331 - 124 - 455 and Doug Talbot with 310 - 139 - 449 was third.

Bob Tucker and Allan Bunnett tied for first place in the D.H. Accuracy with 59/80. Eric Sullivan again took second place for the day with 57/80 (including two near misses) and Ron Shirley was third with 51/80. A. Bunnett, R. Tucker, E. Sullivan, R. Shirley, R. Kildahl, R. Ellis and R. Tichbon all scored with four accuracy casts.

weather conditions: Southerly winds with most of the northern beaches looking in good condition and deep water close in, indicating excellent angling prospects, but once again the fish were very hard to locate. 34 members, 3 juniors, 1 visitor and 1 junior visitor made up a total attendance of 39.

I was pleased to see several of our newer members along, amongst whom were Harry Barrot, R. Broinowski, H. Cunningham and Mike Dawson. Archie Ticklie made his presence felt after a tailor took to him and bit his leg and later he grazed his arm on a rock requiring some patching up with the First Aid kit. Incidentally, members are reminded that this kit is always available at the weigh in area on Field Days.

15 members journeyed over on the first boat, the remainder arriving on the afternoon boat. Two trucks were required to transport members northwards and judging from reports it was an adventure just to make the trip - if you weren't hit by overhanging branches or dislodged from your perch when the vehicle became airborne it was only a matter of luck.

As usual members scattered in all directions and the job of keeping tab of everyone's happenings was difficult. However reports indicated that the Rifle Range area that had previously been productive for skippy anglers was to prove barren as Allan Bunnett and Allan Livesey found, although Allan Bunnett did have one good run but his reluctance (?) to leave his sleeping bag lost him a rig.

Roger Broinowski was noticed with a broad smile after landing a nice mulloway but Norm Clark was not so happy when after several strikes he failed to connect. Ron McQueen suffered a similar fate, losing several fish on a sand bank a little distance offshore where the surge was quite strong. I was fortunate to land 3 tailor in the same area, all caught on the jag on the bottom of the rig indicating that they were just mouthing the bait.

Returning to camp in the evening, I passed Bob Jensen, Ken Hunt, and Rick Jensen who had also found trouble in locating the tailor

although Bob and Rick weighed in several nice Flathead. Back at the hut after the usual wisecracking etc., most members retired early so as to make another attempt in the morning. Denis Rogers and Don Webb headed south but after a wrong turn found themselves on the way back to camp! Ken Jones appears in danger of losing his "pathfinders" badge. Incidentally Ken weighed in a good bag of fish later in the morning.

So it was over, and the usual cleaning up taken care of, congratulations given to the award winners and the journey home commenced. The boat used for the return was of all steel construction and it was just as well the weather was cool or the upper deck would have been like a hot plate. ### PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR CATCH

In these days of vastly improved cameras - both in colour and black and white - it is worth giving a little more thought to the inevitable photograph of the catch. Many people just grab a camera and get the angler and his catch to stand any place that happens to be handy.

The usual and most popular method is to have the fish held by the proud captor. If this is the way you want it, beware of your background which usually consists of a light pole, a wire fence or backyards with washing flapping about.

Always try to get a plain light colored background if it is a dark fish and a dark background if it is a very light colored fish.

Hold the fish horizontally in front of you with both hands making sure the fingers do not cover up any important parts. Never try the old trick of holding it out at arms length to make it look bigger than it is.

Move in close with the camera and take your pictures from the person's waist up, if you want to get the proud fisherman's pleased expressions.

Most cameras these days either have a range finder or are twin lens reflexes. Focusing is easy, but make sure that you have the focus exactly right. You can get away with a rather poor exposure if your fish is in focus, but the best exposed negative is useless if the fish is all blurred.

Set the shutter on 1/100 of a second - and this should ensure you will not get any camera movement if you are not too steady with the shutter release.

If you use the good old faithful box camera, check to see if it has a close-up lens built in - many models have - and this allows you to get within five feet. If it has not make sure you are not closer than eight feet.

Preferably take your fish where it is caught, out at sea, in the boat or on the beach.

Avoid standing up with the rod in one hand, a fishing bag over your back, and draping the fish down alongside one trouser leg where you can't see it and where it has to compete with all the other paraphernalia. Hold it up near your face level and look at the fish NOT at the camera, it is the fish we want to see most, you come second even if you did catch a record.

OCTOBER FIELD DAY
