DRY CASTING NEWS SEPTEMBER 1965.

Twenty-seven members attended this month's drycasting events held at the Floreat Park Oval. Easterly winds prevailed all morning, and the expected sou'wester did not eventuate.

The longest cast in the level ling distance event was made by W. Bridger with 419 ft. followed by K. Jones, 371 ft. and A. Bunnett with 362 ft. The winner of this event was D. Clegg with 297-148-445, second place went to B. Payne, 268-170-438, and third was B. Utting, 318-115-433.

82 yards and 62 yards were the targets for the D.H. Accuracy. In this event, K. Hunt and D. Talbot scored bulls with E. Sullivan and K. Jones with 'near misses'. D. Talbot seems to be showing us the way in the event once again with a total score of 59. B. Utting close second with 58. Three members scored 47, -- E. Sullivan, B. Tichbon, and R. Kildahl. Nine members scored with all four casts.

The S.H. Accuracy of 122 ft., and 92 ft. was once again won by R. Tucker with 30/40, also in second place. N. Cross with 26/40 and D. Clegg, 24/40. The bulls scored in this event were by E. Bridger, D. Clegg, R. Jensen, and T. Smith. Also four members scored with all four casts.

Out of the eight casts in the accuracy, three members scored with all 8 casts -- W. Bridger, N. Cross, and R. Tucker. The overall winners for the day were D. Clegg, 120 points, B. Utting and R. Kildahl, each with 107 points, and E. Sullivan with 104 points.

No records were broken, and there was only one member to reduce his handicap. B. Payne reduced from 170 to 168.

ROTTNEST FIELD DAY, 11-12TH SEPTEMBER 1965.

Weather conditions for this venue were ideal (perhaps a little too ideal), a very light South-easterly and fairly calm seas with only a slight swell on the West End of the Island.

32 Senior members, 2 visitors and 2 juniors made up a total of 36 in all attending the venue, and after a pleasant journey over in the "Kat" the truck was loaded, and all members journeyed by bus to their various destinations. First stop by the bus was made for Bob Jensen and Ken Hunt at Geordie Bay, then off to "Radar" area where about a dozen of the boys had a quick look at the reef and decided it was perfect to fish with only ankle deep water running over it. Among the boys to stay here were Norrie Cross and his friend Bruce McIntyre, who I believe slept in the old bunker with a hive of bees under the floorboards. Eric Sullivan Tom Smith, Dave Latto, Doug Talbot and Denis Bodle slept in one Bunker while Bill Utting, Ron Kildahl, Hew Hoy Yew and Warren Minnett were in the other with some friends of Bills. Arthur Horton Don Webb, Lofty Griffiths, Roger Broinowski, Terry Fuller were some who decided to fish from the West End Area, but this spot proved to be almost barren except for a few rock fish and an Eel caught by Lofty.

Tiger Lilly, Hugh Gregory, Ted Savage and Ron Mansfield decided to fish at a point closer to the settlement and they certainly produced some fish, Bob eventually taking off the heaviest bag award with Tailor and Salmon weighing 68 lbs.

Some of the other captures of note were Doug Talbot's Crayfish and Tom Smith's Buff Bream of 11.1/2 lbs., the heaviest fish caught on the venue.

It was pleasing to see the more fortunate anglers sharing their hard won captures with unlucky anglers, and this reflects good Club spirit between all Club Members. There were some mighty tired anglers on the return trip to Fremantle, and we all enjoyed another calm crossing.

So ended a busy venue. -- My many thanks to all members for the help I received, Tom Smith, Ian McLennan, and many others were kept busy checking figures etc. My heartiest congrats to Award Members who all fished hard and long for their captures.
