Property Officer Ray Walker has advised the President that all is going well with the property. Ray is recovering from a knee replacement.

Field Days. Peter Osborne reported briefly on the Rottnest and Port Gregory field days. Ken Howells will run the September local Field day and said the weigh in will be at the Narrows Bridge.

Dry Casting Ron Thomas said September dry casting had not yet been run.

Terry Fuller said he had received an email from City of Stirling changing some of the dates the Club had requested.

The Club can't have Yokine Reserve on Sunday 5 October due to maintenance work. City of Stirling have booked us Sunday 12 October, which is currently listed for the Field day. It was agreed to defer the October Field day to 18/19 October and have Dry casting on 12 October.

The Club can't have Yokine Reserve on Sunday 7 December due to a booking for a Tee Ball Carnival. City of Stirling have booked us Sunday 14 December which is currently listed for the Field day. Options for December are very limited due to Christmas and Bunnings sausage sizzle. Yokine Reserve is available on 30 November but would need to be booked very soon to secure it. It was agreed to defer a decision on possible changes of Field day and dry casting dates for December.

AAA report George Holman said the AAA Annual General meeting and elections had been held in August. He advised members that delegates from the Club still had difficulties in doing their jobs as delegates due to continuing problems with minutes, etc. He tabled copies of a report he has given to the other Delegates to AAAWA and said Club members could take away a copy and read it.

<u>Reel Talk</u> Editor Terry Fuller said the President's report in the September Reel Talk had accidentally left out four paragraphs with news about members, and he handed out a complete version. The October Reel Talk will be out later than usual due to an extended trip to Port Gregory for the Field day.

General business George Holman said former Club member Dennis Green had fished the Port Gregory area recently and that some good fish had been caught.

Peter Pekaar asked for permission to borrow the Club's laser measure for a casting day at the Melville Club. Pat McKeown questioned free loans of such valuable equipment. Terry Fuller said that the laser is vital for the Club's regular dry casting and any such loans should be clearly on the basis that any damage or loss must be paid for by the borrower. The cost of replacement equipment to do the job of the current laser is about \$700.

Mark Hansen moved Allan Jones seconded that the laser be loaned for use at a Melville club's casting event with a requirement for replacement if lost/damaged, motion carried.

<u>Raffle</u> First prize, a cap and spool of leader line won by Allan Jones, second prize, a lure also won by Allan Jones and donated back and won on a second draw by Ron Thomas. These prizes donated by the Club.

If you <u>really</u> can't get there early or <u>really must</u> leave early, please make sure you explain why to other people, and help more while you are there so that you do your share.


Fees \$10 per person, \$12 per family, to help cover booking charges for the oval and public liability insurance.

Operating procedures required by Bunnings

For safety of all involved, no persons under the age of 15 are permitted to operate any equipment. It is recommended that between 3 and 5 people work in the BBQ area.

Bread, onions and meat should only be removed from packaging when cooking and only in the amounts required at that time.

No raw product should be kept uncovered or out of esky prior to cooking.

Money should be handled by people not cooking or handling the food product.

Recorder's report

Recorder's records and history. As reported in the September Reel Talk, I have received the records/history packed up by the previous Recorder. These records/history were only paper copies but no computer files or printed summaries or listings.

Species and Masters competitions. To my knowledge, no summary of Junior Masters, Masters or Grand Masters competition entries has been published in Reel Talk in the last 10 years or so. I found a list on page 6 of the April 2000 Reel Talk.

Action Point No. 5 from Committee meeting April 2012 was to update the Masters and Grand Master listing for the Reel Talk. Now I am Recorder, I have worked on that.

Fortunately, in a previous changeover of Recorders in December 2009, I received some computer files from the previous Recorder of the time, although those were not up to date.

I also have all the fishing Field day Excel spreadsheets since the 2001/2 competition year.

I have kept the Species competition listings up to date since 2010 and published these and updates in Reel Talk from time to time, and recently in a separate file on the website.

I have been through the records I have, and have updated the list of Junior Masters, Masters and Grand Masters competition entries using that previous file and spreadsheets since 2001/2.

It seems that at least 2 members have been qualified for the Masters competition badge for more than 2 years, but didn't know and weren't acknowledged.

It is obvious that some policy decisions need to be made about the administration and handling of these Species and Masters competitions, with these written down and published so that everyone knows what happens and how it will be done.

I have written a policy on handling Species and Masters fishing competitions. The policy has been adopted at the September Committee meeting, and placed on the Club website <u>http://www.surfcasters.iinet.net.au/Policies.html</u>

Some extracts from the approved policy are:

The Club's policy is that these competitions are to recognise the **personal achievements** of an individual Club member while a member of the Club, and are **not competitions between members**.

The Club will attempt to ensure that all eligible fish are recognised and recorded by maximising the eligibility.

All fish caught while a financial member of the Club are eligible if they meet the requirements.

Changes to the rules to add eligible species, split categories or reduce minimum weights will be retrospective, that is, earlier captures which would be eligible under the amended rules will be considered as though those amended rules had applied at the time of capture.

Changes to the rules to remove species or increase the minimum weight will not be retrospective, that is earlier recorded captures which were eligible under the previous rules at the time will remain eligible so that there is no disadvantage to the member from the change.

Fish caught on Club fishing Field days will be entered by the Club Recorder. No action or separate entry form will be needed from the member.

Fish caught on other than Club fishing Field days will require a Fishing competition application form.

The Recorder will check all applications for annual fishing competitions for eligibility for these Species and Masters competitions and will add these even if the member has not listed these competitions in the application.

A member may ask for a capture to be added by advising the Recorder of the details of a capture already recorded in the Club's fishing Field days or Open competitions.

A member may ask for eligible captures to moved from one competition to another or not to be included.

And yes, I did declare my personal interest in that because of my past membership of the Club from 1962 till 198? when I actually used to go fishing lots more, and catch of species which have recently been added to the Species list.

People who have been members for many years may also have more species listed. Please let me know of any extra species not already listed.

I've already done most of this work, including some of the retrospective stuff and check of captures while a financial member.

Reel Talks before 2001 can't be searched by computer and the printed or scanned versions need to be looked at individually, an enormous job even if the catch details are in there.

Please see the lists below. Please let me know if any changes are needed.

Competition Rules and application forms for the Club's fishing competitions are on the Club website. If you have old versions, please get a some current versions.

<u>The future.</u> Now that I have caught up with the overdue work that needed to be done, the Recorder's job should only take about 10 or 15 minutes a month.

The Recorder's Field day books passed over to me all seem to be summaries of Field day points, total weights, section winners, etc, from 1971 up to 1996. They do not list numbers of fish, species and individual weights of fish, except for Section winners.

They do not include any detailed listing of member's individual catches on Field days before the 2001-2002 season when Excel spreadsheets first started to be used (as far as I know.)

When I last catalogued some property in early 2010, I listed one "Green book" with lots of such details, but only from March 2008 up to 2010.

The current Field Day Officer does not hold any earlier "Green books" or equivalents. Does anyone know where they might be, please?

Species badge rules, from section 5.1 of Competition Rules, are:

- 1. Submit entries to the Recorder on the appropriate form, **unless caught on a Field Day.**
- 2. Fish may be caught at any time including on Club fishing Field Days.
- 3. A member must capture ten (10) of the listed species to qualify for a Species badge.
- 4. Weighing of fish, photographs and witnesses to weight are optional.
- 5. Fish must be a minimum of 20 cm or comply with Department of Fisheries minimum lengths if these are greater.

A few memories of hot weather, holidays and cars

I've tried to remember the first cars my parents had. Don't recall Dad having a car when we lived in Perth but when he was transferred (Police) to Big Bell in the Murchison he had to have a car to be able to carry out his patrols of the outlying sheep stations. Whatever it was it had running boards, which we loved to stand on, no springs which is no joke on an unsealed corrugated country road, a gear shift stick that used to become detached at the wrong moment like trying to cross a running creek bed or climbing a very steep hill and.... wooden wheel spokes! Which over time I came to hate as it was our job to sandpaper the damned things down before Dad would paint them.

The big event was watching Dad with the crank handle, crank up the motor, then listen to the descriptive expletives when the bloody thing back fired on him. I swear, in 10 minutes he never repeated the same word twice!

That same old jalopy took us from Big Bell to Dongara, and back, on sheep station tracks which often disappeared when they crossed the clay pans. Part of the repair kit that was carried was a pack of chewing gum packets cos if the radiator sprung a leak we all had to sit roadside and chew like hell so that he could block up the hole!

That was the most amazing trip that I think that I have ever been on. Only regret is that I did not know about keeping diaries in my very young years. One of the sheep stations we called into the husband was a shearer and away for months of the year. If I remember correctly the mistress of the station looked after the property with a bunch of jackaroos and she had at least 6 kids, miles and miles from the nearest civilisation. When we arrived at the homestead there was not a child in sight. She explained that the kids had the run of the place and to round them up she simply whistled up the sheep dogs (blue heelers) whose job it was to round up the kids. Sure enough, after she had whistled up the dogs, they all came back with the wrist of a child firmly held between their teeth!

Dongara, after the hot dry red dusty Murchison, was like Heaven on a stick. Big Moreton Bay fig trees and that wonderful white sand and the most beautiful blue Indian Ocean. Cool nights so we could sleep at night without it being 35 degrees at midnight day in and day out. With my two brothers we spent every day either climbing trees, riding a sheet of corrugated iron down a sand hill, or swimming and / or sitting in a dinghy fishing. Our job was to catch the little whiting that Mum and Dad would use on their big hooks at night to catch much bigger fish.

We used to love the evenings when the fisher folk would gather together on the beach, cord lines loaded up, tilly lamps festooning the beach and giving the whole evening a real party atmosphere.

Mind you I think there was a cold bottle or two of the "Black Swan" concealed in the picnic baskets plus the odd bottle of gin and tonic.

One fishing evening when the sky had turned to purple black my step mother. all 5ft and a half inch of her, who was sitting down at the time holding onto a baited cord line took off across the beach like an express train. She was a pretty strong and feisty person and was madly trying to dig her heals into the sand to try and stand when she hit the water. She seemed to plane along the top of the water for a good fifty yards or more heading for South Africa, with dad screaming at her to let go of the line, when the line snapped and she sank down into the water. Nothing turned around to bite her but she must have hooked a good sized shark.

Back at the Bell and back at the school I don't think I will ever forget the look on my school teacher's face when I was reciting to the class "What I Did in the School Holidays" and told them about mum and added Dad's comments "That it took him and a bottle brush 6 weeks to get the sand out of Mum!"

Ah well – all of that and I simply just started off thinking about cars.

Demersal and other closures, fishing licences

Just some reminders. The closure period for capture and keeping of demersal species in the entire West Coast region starts on 15 October and goes until 15 December inclusive. If you are lucky enough to catch a pink snapper or other demersal species you are not allowed to keep it, and there are big fines.

The seasonal spawning protection closure for Pink Snapper in Cockburn and Warnbro Sounds starts on 1 October and goes until 31 January inclusive.

The closed season for Blue Swimmer crabs in Cockburn Sound started on 1 September and goes to 14 December inclusive.

Licences are not required for line fishing for finfish from the shore. Don't forget you DO need a current Recreational Fishing From Boat Licence if you use a powered boat to reach your shore line-fishing location. Fishermen have been checked and found with licences which have expired and have been fined.

Full details of licences required for other species and closures are in the State wide Recreational Fishing Guide on the Department of Fisheries website.

September 2014 field day

Overview. The September 2014 away fishing field day was held on the long weekend from 1pm Saturday 27 September to 10am Monday 29 September and with boundaries from the mouth of the Murchison River at Kalbarri to Bowes River at Horrocks with the club members fishing beaches at Wagoe and Port Gregory.

As voted on by club members, the SCAC field day was undertaken in parallel with the AAAWA State Rock and Beach Championship held in the same location from 1pm Saturday to 4pm Sunday.

As in May, a bit disappointing in that the numbers of SCAC members attending this venue was down considerably. However the results in the AAA competition showed that Surfcasters can hold their heads up high and while extreme weather conditions were encountered, Surfcasters presented some competitive bags at the weigh-in.

For the local event, there were very limited results. See the write up later.

<u>The trip.</u> Some of us drove up to the area on Wednesday to allow some looking around before the competition weekend.

In conjunction with the AAA briefing, the Club sign on was at the Port Gregory Caravan Park at 11am on Saturday 27 September, with some who had already signed on at the September General meeting. The fishing period was from lines down at 1pm on the Saturday with fishing through the evening with the lines up at to suit returning to the Port Gregory Caravan Park and have bags placed in the nominated AAA area by 4pm on Sunday 28 September. With lines up for the Club's fishing competition at 10am on Monday, the SCAC weigh-in was held at Port Gregory at 11am on the Monday due to the location of the majority of Surfcasters.

For the away trip a total of 11 SCAC members signed on. George Holman, Pat McKeown, Martin Wearmouth, Terry Fuller, David Maxted, Ray Walker, Peet and Sandra Wessels, Dean Stewart, and a prospective new club member Peter Butland along with FDO Peter Osborne.

Overcast with periods of rain, very windy and a huge swell prevailed for the Saturday. This gave poor fishing conditions with some favourite spots unfishable, particularly along Wagoe. On Sunday the conditions changed slightly with no rain and slightly less winds but the swell was just as high.

Peet and Sandra camped on Wagoe beach, Peter Osborne put up a tent at the Wagoe Chalets. The rest of the team had cabins etc. down at Port Gregory, which was luxury accommodation compared to camping out.

George and company fished a couple of beaches south of Port Gregory with some success. Over three days good quality tailor and dart were found with George bagging out on tailor and some dart and a tarwhine. Pat McKeown managed a mulloway of over 3 kg (uncleaned) plus tailor, dart, and one herring. Pat had the heaviest fish with that mulloway.

Martin Wearmouth managed to beach six tailor, four dart and six tarwhine with one tarwhine being caught on a single handed rod. For the SCAC weigh-in, Martin had the heaviest bag of fish, just pipping George by a few grams.

Terry Fuller managed a couple of quality tailor as did Ray Walker with Dean Stewart landing one. Prospective new Club member Peter Butland tried out his 4WD ute, fishing and then sleeping on the beach at this location. As with the rest of this group he beached three quality tailor.

The majority of tailor bags from this group had at least one tailor that was in order of 1.5 kg uncleaned weight.

The Wessels tried their favourite spots along Wagoe beach and reef but most were unfishable. They successfully fished one spot they knew they could catch dart. They fished a Wagoe beach with white water suds rolling over sand and minor reef with dart feeding well with hard to detect bites. Despite continued efforts, they could not find tailor or other species.

Peter Osborne initially tried Lucky Bay with only one dart and a tarwhine being landed during the period from Saturday lines down to 2am Sunday morning. Water looked favourable for both tailor and mulloway but these was notable by their absence. Peter fished the same spot on first light but again nil.

Peter tried around Kalbarri for smaller species but with the huge swell, he was not successful except for a wrasse. He then moved to cliffs south of Kalbarri at Pot Ally. Sunday morning success with a quality tailor and a small mulloway and on Monday morning a further sweetlip and a small cod (wirrah). Of course fishing with an Alvey reel and heavy line, the fish had to be winched up the cliff before achieving a successful capture.

When one tentative bite suddenly turns to a fish with real weight and line streaming out on a tight drag this was going to be a good fish. This gives a rush of adrenalin but knowledge under the fishing conditions of high cliff, huge swell and no gaff or gaff man, the landing of such a fish was going to depend not just on skill but good luck. The fish was seen as a large mulloway and estimated to be between 10 to 15 kg. No luck was found and with a set of swells coming through it wasn't long before the line wrapped around rocks and then snapped.

On the AAAWA front, again SCAC can hold their head high. George was runner up in the Veterans individual section and the Veterans team of Peter, George, Pat and Terry won the Veterans team event. Martin won the prize for the heaviest dart.

A look round on Thursday found many places completely weeded out, with banks of weed on the beach and churning up in the swells. But there were still some good looking places which were clear enough to be fished, if only a spot could be found among all the anglers who would be in the area over the long weekend.

George fished late on Thursday afternoon and caught some tailor and saw two mulloway caught by other fishers, so the hopes were up.

After the others arrived on Friday, the late afternoon found the group fishing south of Port Gregory and some very good tailor were caught.

The weather forecast for the weekend was not good, with a strong front and wind change due on Saturday, and it was spot on.

After the briefing for the AAAWA event, we went back to the same spot and waited for the 1pm start, with the northwest wind at about 30 knots straight along the beach at that spot. After the rain band came through, the wind swung to the south west, straight in, and eased as forecast and the rest of the day was reasonable for fishing.

Fish were few but the pickers were also scarce so it was possible to put a bait out and let it soak. Some nice tailor and a few dart were caught, many on rods in rod holders with the fish hooking themselves.

By Sunday morning the weather was good and the wind was kind but the fishing was much the same, with a few tailor and dart. Pat pulled in a nice mulloway which turned out to be the heaviest scale fish for the weekend.

Surprisingly despite the swells and the amount of water coming through from behind the reef, there was no weed in the fishing spot for the whole weekend.

At times the rips were very strong, but not so bad that a heavy sinker and choice of rig and bait didn't handle it and stop the rigs drifting.

Martin Wearmouth stopped on his way back to camp after dark on Sunday for a fish inside the lagoon and had a ball on tarwhine, keeping six and releasing another six or so.

Although there was a lot of water between the fish, and it seemed that it was a lottery if the few that were around would take your bait, everyone had caught some tailor, except Dean.

He was casting well and putting his baits in the right place, putting in the time but he just hadn't had the luck. At 9:10 am on Monday, his luck changed and in came his tailor.
