DRY CASTING NEWS - 1ST AUGUST 1965.

Bright sunny weather attracted twentysix members to the drycasting eventsheld as usual at the Floreat Oval. A slight Nor-East wind was blowing at the start of the day, changing to a South-West later in the morning, upsetting the 'new organisers' first efforts.

In the level line distance event, the best cast was recorded by Bill Bridger, 451 ft., Ken Jones 417 ft., and Allan Bunnett 390 ft. This event was won by Ken Jones with 381-86-467. Second place went to Norrie Cross with 347-93-440, and thirs, H. Yew with 368-71-439.

With the targets in the D.H. Accuracy event at 72 and 52 yds, no bulls were recorded, but 14 members scored with all four casts. It was pleasing to see Doug Talbot win this event with his small rod, and a score of 62/80. A close second was Hew Hoy Yew with 59/80 and Tom Smith third with 58/80.

The S.H. event of 118 ft. and 88 ft. was won by Bob Tucker 29/40, followed closely by Norrie Cross, 27/40, and two members tying for third place - Don Bridger and Ian McLennan each with 24/40. Sic members scored with all four casts, and only one bull was recorded by Allan Bunnett.

Out of the eight casts on the accuracy, only three members were successful, Ron Tucker, Ron Kildahl and D. Clegg.

With the wind in our faces in the second S.H. open event, Bob Tucker was not affected and won this event for the day with a cast of 254 ft. Allan Bunnett in second place scored 217 ft. and Hew Hoy Yew was third with 207 ft.

No records were broken for the day and the winner on the day was Doug Talbot 116 points, Hew Hoy Yew with 112 was second, and Norrie Cross third with 109 points.

Handicaps.

Ken Jones was the only member to alter his handicap. This now stands at 55, being reduced by 31 from 86.

Highlight of the day was the Club Tent going into orbit when the wind unexpectedly changed direction.

FIELD DAY ACTIVITIES 14/15 TH AUGUST 1965 -- GARDEN ISLAND.

Light southerley winds slight ocean swell made for reasonable conditions along all beaches. Attendance was again excellent, with 52 members and visitors attending. This Venue is becoming very popular with all Club members though the fish have the habit of turning up in the most unexpected bays. Where they were caught one month, they did not show this month.

Ron Shirley, Ron Kildahl, Bob Klein tried a change and visited the gun area. Tom Smith and Dave Latto also fished this area, the fish however returned to Ron's original fishing spot on the back beach where Bob Lilly and Ron Mansfield's catch aroused much comment. George Hampton and Mick Doscas also caught Salmon from this bay. Further South, Bob Tichbon and Phil Neri and myself found the Tailor on the bite for approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of an hour and then departed, much to our dismay. The number one position in recent months, the Rifle Range, failed completely. Allen Bunnett Bill Bridger, Hew Hoy Yew, Ron McQueen, Mike Dawson failed to land a fish in the evening. The Salmon apparently were moving further North and when Bob Tichbon and I noticed Bob Lilly in action early in the afternoon, we hoped that the salmon may have carried on down the coast. Bob Tucker was also noticed walking to the third bay North and he had bought young Mark along on the Venue. Later talking to Mark he said he had a wow of a time, and would like to come over every week end, though I'm sure Mrs. Tucker would have something to say about that. Bob Jensen was also busy wading well out to sea, using this single handed rod, and his catch of 9 tailor was excellent on his gear. Ken Hunt, Kevin Clugston were also fishing near us and young Kevin landed a nice Salmon behind a reef.

There were plenty of fires along the Beach as the southerley had a bite to it, and Edgar had the misfortune to break the tip of his rod and carried on with his small rod. He also landed a good size flat-head before 4 o'clock. Doug Newton "staying over at the island" fished around the third bay with little success. From all reports Mick Doscas and Doug have made many fine captures on the island in the past week - Salmon, Tailer, and Skips being plentiful, however on the Venue they could not catch a good bag between them. Just goes to show one never knows with certainty just where the fish may turn up.

After returning to the hut we had a hot drink and so to bed and all members aroused early around 5 a.m. and hurried off to the beaches eager to improve their captures of the previous night.

Norm Clark, Ron McQueen and Mike Dawson fished in the second bay in the morning and were delighted when they finally landed several tailor. John Matthews battled on however to no avail. The Tailor were only picking at the baits and of course many were missed. Bob Tichbon landed two and I four. On arriving at base we prepared for the weigh-in, Bob Lilly's bag and Ron Mansfield's catch aroused much interest. G. Hampton's Salmon held pride of place $10\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. Bob Lilly until that time had the heaviest bag of scale fish with 40 lb.

Owing to a delay at the first pickup point at the North Bay, the vehicle was late arriving, and when the anglers arrived at the weigh-in centre, they reported a terrific haul of Salmon by W. Minnett, D. Clegg and S. Knezy. We were all staggered at the number of Salmon to be weighed, and I had visions of having lunch on the island before we were finished. With a will the Weigh-in was commenced again, Allan Bunnett, Ron Kildahl and Hew Hoy Yew on the weighing did a great job, surrounded by heaps of Salmon and many of the lads looking on with amazement.

W. Minnett (160 lbs) finally took off the heaviest bag section and S. Knezy the heaviest scale fish, Salmon $10\frac{3}{4}$ lbs., just passing Blue Hampton salmon by $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. Many of the salmon were shared out to members therefore what started out a quiet weigh-in developed into a flood of fish. What a venue, it appears for sure we would be in for a record breaking year, for fish captures on Field Days, so roll along lads, your turn next.

The captures by Warren Minnett, Doug Clegg, and S. Knezy, 160 lbs $114\frac{1}{4}$ lbs. and 140 lbs respectively, deserve special mention and Warren's capture is the highest bag of scale fish ever recorded by a member of a Field day. My heartiest congrats.

So closed another busy Venue with many thanks for help received during the venue. Hoping for a good roll-up in September at Rottnest. Details as listed.

High Tides or fresh Southerly winds would make angling difficult if not impossible. Bait casting or Balloons (if possible) is the score in this area. There is some shelter available at Block House.

Strickland Bay Area.

Generally suitable for the beach angler. Southerly winds would be excellent here - no shelter available. Sheet of Canvas around bed rolls is a good idea.

Blobs and spoon sinkers would be handy. Wire traces are a must as sharks abound in these waters.

Carry your own water supply - Ice boxes if hot.
