In the level line distance event, the best cast was recorded by Bill Bridger, 451 ft., Ken Jones 417 ft., and Allan Bunnett 390 ft. This event was won by Ken Jones with 381-86-467. Secon place went to Norrie Cross with 347-93-440, and thirs, H. Yew with 368-71-439.

With the targets in the D.H. Accuracy event at 72 and 52 yds, no bulls were recorded, but 14 members scored with all four casts. It was pleasing to see Doug Talbot win this event with his small rod, and a score of 62/80. A close second was Hew Hoy Yew with 59/80 and Tom Smith third with 58/80.

The S.H. event of 118 ft. and 88 ft. was won by Bob Tucker 29/40, followed closely by Norrie Cross, 27/40, and two members tying for third place - Don Bridger and Ian McLennan each with 24/40. Sic members scored with all four casts, and only one bull was recorded by Allan Bunnett.
