
MEETINGS

Entries for Game Fish Badge, Club Records and Open Fishing Competitions must be lodged with the recorder within 30 days of capture,





ROTTNEST ISLAND

ROTTNEST: Beginning from its eastern-most point: Natural Jetty: Renowned for year round tailor fishing, can be fished in any wind except due easterly. High tale brings dangerous rips on "jetty" itself (really a low-lying reef promontory), but then baits can be east from shore on either side of reef. Good also for skippick, hertring. South-east Hickley Beach for enker fishing at night for big tailor, salmon, multoway, sharks. Thompson Bay jettless: Herring any time in May and June. Night fishing all year for pike, herring, cobbler.

Bathurst Point: Herring, pilchard and garfish off sewage rock, avoided by many because of effluent outler. On the point is a high cliff overlooking a small, deep hay, with steep climb to waterline rock ledge, good for herring, garfish, skippack, tarwhine; tailor at night. Lighthouse rocks, spots for night tailor and pike fishing, flat rock for herring, garfish Basin Bay, east point for night tailor fishing; basin reefs for marning and evening tailor, skippack, occasionally salmon. Geordie Bay eastern rocks ideal for fishing on easterly wind for skipjack, herring, garfish. Geordle jetty and west rocks for herring, garfish in day, herring, tailor, pike at night

Parrakeet Bay: Rock lishing for herring, garfish, skipjack. North Point: Deep, rocky bottom for occasional jewfish, groper, kingfish, king george whiting, skipjack, berring, big tailor. Little Armstrong: Herring, garfish, small skipjack, City of York Bay: Good winter spot for skipjack, herring, garfish, tailor. Ricey Beach: Night beach lishing for salmon, tailor, sharks, day reef fishing for salmon, tailor, skipjack, king george whiting. Abraham Point: Skipjack, herring, garfish Celia Rocks: Very deep water, potential jewfish, groper, shark, see kinglish Mable Cove: West side of cove, deep fishing for possible jewfish, groper, surface for herring, garfish, skipjack



Eagle Bay: East side for herring, garfish, skipjack; west sade for reel crayfish on low tide, deep holes for jewfish, sharks, groper, big tailor. Fish Hook Bay: Groper, skipjack, herring, salmon, garfish, off waterline rock ledge at western point; flat rocks for herring, skipjack, salmon in betily of bay. Radar Reef: Popular roef fishing spot for tailor, salmon, skipjack, herring, sharks, pike, groper, jewfish, kingfish, king george whiting, steep cliff climb. Mary Cove: Excellent on north wind; tailor, salmon, skipjack, king george whiting, pike, herring; best fishing around high rock headland. Green Island: Jetty of herring, garfish, eastern end reefs for tailor, big skipjack, herring. Salmon Bay: Shallow sandy beach, favourite haunt for schooling salmon. Salmon Pelat: Good skiejack pools. Parker Point: Anchorage; herring, garfish, sand skipjack, whiting. Henrietta Rocks: Favourite herring haunt; also garfish, skipjack, Jubilee Rocks: Another favourite herring haunt. Rottnest deepses and game fishingt Dealt with in other sections of Sandgropers' Guide.





The quy I am working with down here had some friends over from Melbourne last weekend. They were very keen scuba divers and we yarned about fishing etc when we met on the Friday. On the Sunday they were out diving near one of the offshore islands when suddenly, they were confronted by A WHITE POINTER estimated to be about 15-17feet long. The guys were about thirty metres from their boat and at the mercy of this monster. It swam around them for about ten minutes becoming more and more agitated. On several occasions it came so close to them that they had to physically push it away with their hands. They slowly and eventually made it back to their boat and just as the second one climbed into the boat the shark came from under the boat and brushed his flippers......

END OF ROUND ONE

ROUND 2: Monday morning the two divers. Mal and Howard, came around to our factory to tell the tale and to look for "recruits" to go out and do some "BIG GAME FISHING"they didn't have to ask me twice. Firstly, we had to get some tackle (I wanted to use my gear, futile but fun, but these guys were serious!)

The tackle was arranged thus: -

I sealed a 44 gallon petrol drum anchored to the bottom on 100 feet of hylon rope attached to approximately 2001bs of railway line. Attached to the 44 gallon drum was 15 feet of heavy chains shackled to 30 feet 1/4 steel cable shackled to a forged hook about size 30/0 then to a slick going to a burley bomb which was attached to the 44 in the form of a 4 gallon drum of blood (from the local abattion), fish oil and some fish from my freezer. Having secured all the gear (courtesy of the Esperance Port Authority) all we needed was balt- we couldn't find a volunteer scuba diver so we settled for a cow's head (no bull) once again courtesy of the abbatoir. We were ready so it was down to the boat:-

SHOCK!! HORROR!!

We were going after a great white shark in a sixteen foot boat. Stupidity soon overcame fear and we were on our way. It took about 20 minutes to get to "the spot" and once there it was obvious I was the only one who hadn't seen "it". I was delegated to rig the line and set it over the side while everyone else stayed rooted to the centre of the boat. The line was set so we left with no sightings....tomorrow would tell.

ROUND 3: As is they way with the weather here conditions blew up overnight and were not suitable for a 16 foot shark dingy so the kill was off and it was back to work for me. The conditions continued much to our disappointment but on the Thursday Mal managed to con a ride with a pro fisherman. George Greaves (a gentleman I believe Dick Stevens will remember). Unfortunately there was only room for two and so I missed out.

THE CLIMAX....ANTICLIMAX?

They arrived at the spot to find nothing- no drum, no cable...nothing. They searched for two hours before giving up.

So if you see a 44 gallon drum being followed by a four gallon drum approaching your reef stand, try and grab the hook it is worth \$18.00

CONSOLATION

The boys went out fishing with George after the search and caught 140 snapper to 121bs and 7 sampsons 35-451bs.


